Self-Assessment Questions by Scenario

The self-assessment questions below are designed to help viewers reflect on and react to the job duties shown in each scenario. There are three types of questions:

- Questions about **effectiveness** -- how good or effective do you think you might be in the situations or performing the tasks shown in the realistic job preview?
- Questions about **interest** how interested are you in filling the roles and responsibilities outlined in the realistic job preview?
- Questions on **key takeaways** -- were you able to pick up on the major themes conveyed through the scenarios?

These questions can serve as the basis for individual self-reflection or interactive classroom or group discussions.

Scenario 1: Roll Call

- 1. Would you be successful in a job that involves teaching or training new coworkers, or "showing them the ropes" as Officer Ramirez will do with Officer Davis?
- 2. Police Officers typically wear highly recognizable uniforms on the job. How would you feel about a job that involves wearing a uniform?

Scenario 2: Convenience Store Theft

- 1. How would you feel about a job that involves working closely with local business owners like Mr. Garcia to solve crime problems like shoplifting?
- 2. How would you feel about a job that involves gathering information, brainstorming to generate a variety of solutions, and applying these solutions to problems?
- 3. Would you be successful in a job that involves collecting and analyzing key information and coming up with solutions to problems like Mr. Garcia is dealing with?
- 4. Which of the following is the MOST important takeaway from this scenario?
 - a) Effective police work involves working with members of the public to solve crime problems.
 - b) Effective police work involves collecting evidence that a crime has been committed before making arrests.
 - c) Effective police work involves finding ways to get business owners to solve their own crime problems.

Scenario 3: Traffic Stop with Open Warrant

- 1. For many situations that police officers face, there are set policies and procedures that must be followed to effectively uphold the law. How would you feel about a job where this is a regular requirement?
- 2. How would you feel about a job that involves arresting and detaining suspects and enforcing laws?
- 3. Would you be successful in a job that involves adapting when situations or circumstances change?
- 4. Would you be successful in a job that involves managing your stress level in situations that escalate quickly?
- 5. Which of the following is the MOST important takeaway from this scenario?
 - a) Police officers need to treat everyone as a potential suspect.
 - b) Police officers always need to be alert to criminal activity.
 - c) Police officers need to be ready to adapt and respond to any situation.

Scenario 4: Traffic Crash

- 1. How would you feel about a job that involves dealing with frustrated, angry, or emotional members of the public while remaining calm yourself?
- 2. Would you be successful in a job that involves using your communication skills to calm distressed people like Mrs. Bennett?
- 3. What was Officer Ramirez most likely trying to accomplish by giving the toy to Haley?
 - a) Check to see if Haley is injured.
 - b) Relate to and comfort Haley.
 - c) Remind Haley's mother that she needs to take care of her daughter.

Scenario 5: Traffic Crash Report

- 1. How would you feel about a job that involves documenting activities, writing detailed reports, and filling out forms on a regular basis?
- 2. Would you be successful in a job that involves conveying your thoughts verbally or in writing in a clear, concise, and organized manner?

- 3. Sometimes police officers must testify in court. How would you feel about a job that involves testifying in court?
- 4. Would you be successful in a job that involves paying close attention to details and making careful observations?
- 5. Which of the following is the MOST important takeaway from this scenario?
 - a) In the policing profession, accurate and thorough reporting is critical.
 - b) Police officers have to fill out accident reports in a timely manner.
 - c) Not all police officers have to write detailed reports.

Scenario 6: Traffic Enforcement

- 1. How would you feel about a job that involves having the discretion to make your own decisions in challenging situations?
- 2. How would you feel about a job that involves conducting traffic stops and issuing citations?
- 3. Would you be successful in a job in which it is hard to predict what might happen on any given shift?
- 4. Which of the following is the MOST important takeaway from this scenario?
 - a) Police officers are required by law to issue tickets for traffic violations.
 - b) Effective police officers are firm, respectful, and explain the context of their actions.
 - c) Police work involves educating the public about safety.

Scenario 7: Panhandling Complaint

- 1. Would you be successful in a job that involves collaborating with social workers or other service-providers to solve problems in your community?
- 2. How would you feel about a job that involves working with sensitive populations such as individuals experiencing homelessness or substance abuse problems?
- 3. How would you feel about a job that involves dealing with chronic offenders on a regular basis?
- 4. Which of the following is the MOST important takeaway from this scenario?
 - a) Effective police officers should know about social and public health issues.

- b) Effective police officers understand that some members of the public will always have problems.
- c) Effective police officers understand that making an arrest may not always be the right solution to a problem.

Scenario 8: Community Meeting

- 2. Would you be successful in a job that involves serving as a representative or spokesperson for your organization at public events?
- 3. Which of the following is the MOST important takeaway from this scenario?
- 4. Would you be successful in a job that involves public speaking and fielding questions on the spot?
